CATALYST FOR SOLUTIONS TO UNMET NEEDS

We convene individuals and organizations to identify unmet needs and serve as a catalyst for collaborative solutions.



- Expanded partnerships with local employers and GNRC-Area Agency on Aging (AAAD) for our **Eldercare Coach** program, providing 226 working caregivers with eldercare education, Helpline support and personalized phone consultations
- Connected 18,347 older adults, caregivers & professionals to community resources via our print & online **Directory of Services**, and updated content & published our 2023-2024 edition
- Launched a new webinar series, Keys to Living & Aging Well, in partnership with GNRC-AAAD, the YMCA and Jewish Family Service with recorded segments available on our website
- Convened the Middle Tennessee Elder Watch, generating media coverage for World Elder Abuse Day and hosting two collaborative drive-through shred events for older adults

CHAMPION & ADVOCATE FOR OLDER ADULTS

We advocate for and with older adults and family caregivers to enhance our community and support positive aging.







- Chaired the TN Coalition for Better Aging and led collective advocacy, prompting the Comptroller's office 2022 Senior Long-Term Care in Tennessee update report and allocation of \$30 million to expand services through the CHOICES and Options programs so that 5,000 more older adults & adults with disabilities receive home and community based support
- Led local affordable housing advocacy with NOAH and others
 resulting in Metro Nashville allocating \$30 million in ARPA funding for
 affordable housing, prioritizing \$8 million for older adults to fund new
 rental units, shared housing improvements and a home share program
- Hosted a record setting 455 attendees at our 30th Annual Sage Awards, honoring 7 inspiring older adults for their lifelong community service, and recognizing the Senior Citizens Awareness Networks (SCAN) of Rutherford & Wilson counties
