September is Healthy Aging Month and a good time to re-focus on the keys to healthy living. The good news is that simple habits and choices benefit our bodies and brains.

What research continues to show is that healthy aging is significantly influenced by what we eat and how we live, particularly physical activity, sleep, stress reduction and social connection. AgeWell board member and geriatrician, Dr. Jim Powers, notes that life expectancy is influenced primarily by

behavioral patterns (40%), then genetics (30%), and social circumstances (15%). In fact, lifestyle factors account for approximately a 10-year difference in life expectancy!

The National Prescription Drug Take Back Day - 10/28/2023 - aims to provide a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposing of prescription drugs, while also educating the general public about the potential for abuse of medications.

COVID-19 Vaccine & Test Information

The CDC authorized updated COVID-19 vaccine boosters for everyone age 6 months and older. People with Medicare can get the updated vaccine with \$0 cost sharing. Medicaid and private insurance will also continue to cover the COVID-19 boosters and the new Bridge Access Program will provide vaccines to people who are uninsured. The updated vaccines are especially timely as data shows COVID-19 rates are rising again in nursing facilities.

In addition, under the prescription drug provisions of the Inflation Reduction Act, <u>vaccines</u> <u>under Medicare Part D</u>, including the new RSV vaccine recommended for older adults this fall, are also covered with \$0 cost sharing.

Beginning September 25, four FREE tests will be available for each household to request at <u>covidtests.gov</u>. Tests will be sent via the USPS starting October 2.
